The Best Tips for Sewing Batiks

- 1 Don't bother to Best Press or starch these...our batiks press great
 - 2 Consider NOT using an iron when piecing. Batiks have a great crease-ability.
 - 3 The best needle for good batiks....Microtex 70 or 75 (best penetration and sharpest stitch)
 - 4 Don't over-think the contrast or the color...some muddy combos work best for blending
- Batiks are your best fabrics to put in unlikely color combos...put them together and step away and look at it AFTER you have sewn them together
