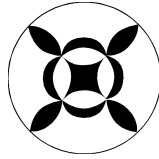

Approval of Secretary’s Meeting Minutes from May

- There were no corrections to the minutes.
- Motion was presented by Penny Schumacher and approved unanimously.

Budget approval for 2016-2017

- Motion was presented by Penny Schumacher and approved unanimously.

BY-LAWS: Laurie Fromm

- Laurie Fromm thanked all who were involved in the process of updating the quilt club’s by-laws. Laurie asked if there were any corrections or suggestions. One suggestion was made by Pat Fackelman who suggested that the By -Laws Section 4, Honorary Membership age be lowered to 72 from 80. Pat felt that there were many folks in this age group who were on fixed incomes and would find the dues difficult to pay. Penny Schumacher gave a little history of how the Honorary Membership came about. A vote was taken and it was determined through the vote of 21 to 12 in favor of keeping the Honorary Membership at age 80.
- Cheryl commented that she felt that the Vice President’s expanded responsibilities (proposed bylaws) that included not only chairing the program committee, but also being the Consortium representative might be too many responsibilities for one officer position in the club. Current VP, Lyz Covert is now attending and reporting on the Quilt Consortium meetings. Vice President would like to continue to attend and report on Consortium meetings.
- Cheryl also observed that last year for most of the meetings, less than 60% of members were in attendance. In this case, a quorum does not exist to take a vote. A question was posed regarding the voting process. How do we include those who do not attend meetings? It was suggested that if a member could not attend a meeting and a vote is to be cast, the member should contact a board member to let them know that they would like to vote.
