## April Meeting and Workshop – Penny Schumacher

Our presenter for our April meeting will be Wenda Coburn. With a passion for sewing, design, quilting and instruction, in 1988 Wenda Coburn started Just for Ewe Sewing, providing a variety of services from traditional tailoring to custom quilt making. Enthusiastic about helping others to experience the joys of sewing, she began teaching in 1998. In 2004, she became a certified Square-in-a-Square instructor and product distributor. In 2007, she earned Diamond Certification and was published in the book, “Moving On With Diamonds.”

Wanting to finish quilts herself, she learned easy machine quilting techniques that gave a beautiful finish. "Quilting with training wheels" became a signature saying used in many of her popular Machine Quilting workshops. In 2006, she began teaching how to quilt on a regular sewing machine and offered resources and tools for home quilters. In 2009, Wenda published the book, Short Arm Machine Quilting. In 2010 and 2011 she was published in Quilter Magazine with articles on short arm machine quilting.

Wenda currently works as a Long Arm Quilter/Quilting Educator in her Liverpool, NY home (when not on a cycling adventure!

After Lyz read the letter the club was told that Sandy's replacement would be Monique Liberti who will serve out Sandy's term from April 1, 2018 - June 30, 2019.

Penny Schumacher will take over Vice President duties as of July 1, 2018 -June 30, 2020. As Lyz's term ends as of June 30, 2018.

counties – Monroe, Livingston, Ontario, Yates, and Wayne. Tickets cannot be sold out of state NY state. If you have questions, please see Laurie.

**Outside Sales for Quilt Show** - Deb McCracken and Betsy Spear will be setting up times to sell the raffle tickets to other quilt clubs and other sites. Please sign up for a time and day that you can help them out.

**Submission for Quilt Show** - Forms will be ready next month to submit your quilt, wall hangings, table runners, etc. to the show. You will need one form for each quilt you wish to enter. At this time there is no limit, but we would like to have at least one quilt from each club member. You must have a label on the back lower back corner. At the ice social in September there will be sign-up sheets to work at the show. So be ready to support your quilt club and sign up for at least one shift.

**Silent Auction** - Liz Brown wants more quilts if possible as well as, bed runners, table runners, placemats, etc. to be put in the silent auction. Jeanne Muhl is making a quilt and pillow for a cherished teddy that was donated to the silent auction. Items should cost \$15.00 or more.

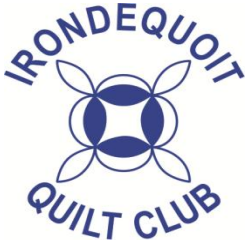

### Entry Form Instructions and Suggestions

**Complete your name and address in the space provided**

**Check the box for the appropriate category** – choose only one

**Please include a name for the quilt** – this adds interest for the viewers and helps the show committee identify each quilt. When a member submits more than one quilt of similar size, it is difficult for the committee to identify each quilt without a name on the entry and on the label.

**Enter the size of the quilt.**

**Who did the quilting?** Please give credit where it is due.

**What is the source of the pattern, designer name?** Please give credit where it is due.

**Was this from a commercial kit?** Give kit name.

**Was this quilt from a class?** Give class name and info.

**Include a description / story of the quilt – again this adds interest for the viewer. This story should include information like:**

- When did you start / finish this quilt
- Was it a UFO
- Was the quilt made as a gift or for a special occasion
- Has it been in a show before? Where? Did it win any awards?
- Describe any special techniques or features.
- What makes this quilt special?

**All quilts must be checked out thru the quilt return process** – to safeguard everyone's quilts, we need to account for each entry. Please do not compromise the club by removing your quilts outside the process. With your cooperation, everyone will have their quilts returned quickly. Thank you.
