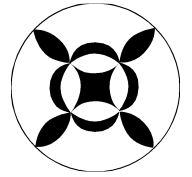

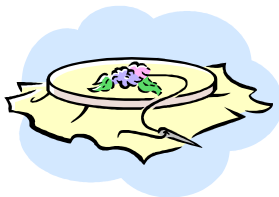

### **Fat Quarter Exchange**

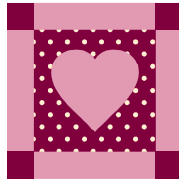
The theme for the January Fat Quarter Exchange was 30s Fabrics.

very simple to make once they are cut from the bolt.

So Kim is ordering the bolt of fabric from Joann Fabrics and will have it delivered to Nancy's house (so we do not have to carry such a large bolt of fabric; it was very heavy) so she and I can cut it up.

Once we get the bolt cut I am hoping that our members will come through again this year and with their sewing skill and help out with this charity project.

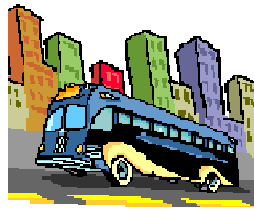
Each participant is being asked to make one project each. Once you've completed that one project, then your admission for these *two days of quilting* is waved. You can't beat that!!

The library is low on magazines. If you have any magazines that you are done with and are willing to share them with the club please turn these in to our librarian Marcia Marano.

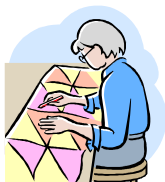
### **Community Cupboard**

#### **Recipe**

I was provided with the recipe for a popular snack that was provided at a club meeting. The recipe for Banana Bars is as follows.

#### **Ingredients:**

- 1 stick margarine (softened)
- 3 eggs
- 2 cups sugar
- 3 very ripe bananas (mashed – I use a couple more)
- 2 cups flour

#### **Instructions:**

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- In a mixing bowl cream butter and sugar.
- Beat in eggs, bananas, and vanilla.
- In a separate bowl combine flour and baking soda.
- Add the dry ingredients to the egg mixture and mix well.

- Place in a greased 15" x 10" pan and bake for 25 minutes until done.
- Cool and then frost.

#### **Frosting:**

- 1 stick margarine softened
- 4 cups confectioner's sugar
- 8 oz cream cheese softened
- 2 tsp. vanilla extract
  
- Cream butter and cream cheese with mixer.
- Gradually add confectioners sugar and vanilla. Beat well.
- Spread over bars.
