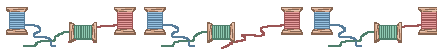

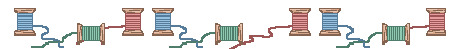


A club of this size takes the assistance of many people to function.

Refreshments are everyone's job this month. We will be having our year end party. We ask that everyone bring an appropriate dish.

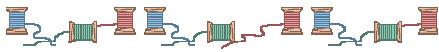

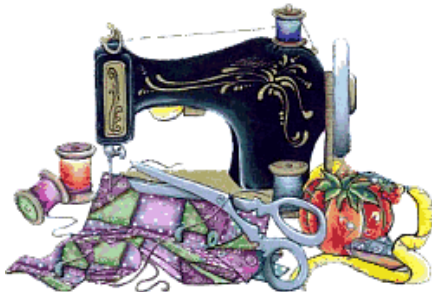

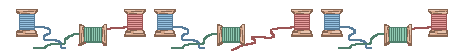
BALANCE 5/5/06 -- \$1436.75

I will be out of town for the May meeting. Any bills or money that needs to come to me would you please give them to Marny Bryant.

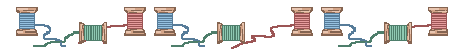

Library

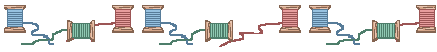
It is the end of the year, so please remember to bring back any books you have out.

Minutes

Christy expressed some frustration with the talking during the start of meeting announcements.

Started with general announcements. Next meeting is the end of Year party.

Charity czar asked for update. Things are winding down for the year for all the charity projects and Elaine Kent offered to take over for Comfort quilts.

Christy raised the possibility of doing a class with Carol Taylor next year. Her classes run approximately \$40 per person and at least 20 people

will be needed to make it feasible.

Mary Randall raised the issue of letting the next officers finalize a decision on this.

Georgia Sadler raised the need to re-vote on disregarding the bylaws to allow Anne Burton to serve as treasurer another year. Her motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

A motion was made to elect a slate of officers including: Ruth Tetlow as President, Pat Fackelman as Vice President, Debbie Butler as Secretary, and Anne Burton as Treasurer. The motion was seconded and voted and again was unanimous.

Christy left at this point and Brenda ran the rest of the meeting.

The issue of raising dues was raised. Rental on the facility was increased this year. It was suggested to raise the dues to \$15. The discussion on the issue was about whether we were short money in the treasury. Anne said the currently balance was \$3,400 (Note: she addresses this in the Treasurer's report this month). It was decided to not go forward with an increase at this point.

The discussion turned to the idea of charging for sew nights. The history of charging for the sew nights, the possible amounts, and different amount for guests were discussed. A motion

was made for charging \$2 per person for each sew night. It was seconded and passed.

Dates were announced for the summer Sew Nights on May 5, June 2, July 7, Aug 4, Sept 15.

Quilt show updates.

Penny Schumacher is looking for people to sign up to do demonstrations. If you have any techniques, products, or ideas you would be willing to share for a short demonstration, see her to sign up.

Judy Andrychuk is distributing the books of tickets that members are expected to sell. If you have not gotten yours yet, please see her.

Lin is still looking for people to sell tickets at the Windmill and the Farmer's market. See her to sign up.

Ruth Julian was collecting star fabric that will be used as give away at the quilt show. Please bring any star fabric you can contribute to give to Ruth.

Mary and all the people involved in setting up the quilt show continue to work hard getting everything together. Since the show will be running on Friday longer, we will need additional people to stay over the night before and help in setting up.

Trish was visiting from Ivy Thimble and mentioned several upcoming quilt store

shops and presented some lovely new products.

We have just a little over 5 months until the show. I hope you are making your entries. If not, it's still not too late to begin!

The Quilt Show forms are ready and will be available for pick up at the May meeting. You may also refer to the web site to download this form.

Please complete these as soon as possible and hand them in to Mary Lou Fitch. Your project does not have to be completed at this time to make an entry. We would like to have as much information available so that the committee can begin cataloging. If you decide not to enter or if it has not been completed in time, just let Mary Lou know.

Your receipt for your entry will serve as proof of ownership when you pick it up after the show. If you are unable to pick your own entry up, you must write the name of the designated person who will be picking it up for you. No entries will be released without this information. Entries will not be released before they have been removed from their areas.

Please abide by this rule to allow us a quick and orderly manner of retrieving your items for you.

I'm looking for a volunteer to refurbish the Quilt Show outdoor signs. They need painting and date/time changes. Please see me if you are interested or know of someone who could help with this project.

An Ice Cream Social will take place on Monday September 11, 2006, giving members the opportunity for Quilt Show sign ups, pay membership dues and reconnect with each other before the regular scheduled meeting.
